Day 1 Monday, July 29, 2019

8 am / Taking Advantage of the New Wave of Minimal Invasive Surgery (MIS) in ICH Stroke Treatment Jean Pruitt, MN, RN, CCNS, FNP-BC, CCRN, CNRN, SCRN

Spontaneous intracerebral hemorrhage (ICH) accounts for 2 million strokes worldwide per year and is the most deadly subtype of stroke with a 1-year mortality rate up to 50%. This presentation will identify new treatments and management including recent research from the 2019 International Stroke Conference (ISC).

At the conclusion of this seminar, the participants should be better able to:

- Discuss the effects of Minimal Invasive Surgery (MIS) in the treatment of ICH.
- Describe the difference in endoscopic, stereotactic thrombolysis with conventional treatment, including medical treatment and conventional craniotomy.
- List three cutting edge research updates from the 2019 ISC specific to ICH treatment particular to techniques and evacuation timing.

10:15 am / Changing Tides in Emergency Management of Acute Ischemic Stroke Patients Rayetta K. Johnson, MSN, Neuroscience CNS, RN, CNRN

This presentation will provide a review of the anatomically oriented types of ischemic stroke and related symptomatology as well as the current treatments and scientific advancements in the management of the stroke patient.

- Explain emergency treatments and current clinical trials for acute ischemic stroke.

Research makes it clear, inflammation is the basis for many systemic diseases, and periodontal inflammation is something that dentists see every day. But, how do we utilize what we now know into our daily practice with new treatment and preventive strategies for optimal oral and overall health?

This presentation will give an update on the latest evidence on the link between periodontal disease and systemic diseases such as heart disease, stroke risk, and cognitive diseases. Additionally, co-management of patients with the medical team with the goal of reduction of total body inflammation will be explored.

Day 3 Wednesday, July 31, 2019 Workplace Violence: De-escalation Strategies and Techniques Quintina P. Smallwood, MSN, RN-BC, CCRN

With violence on the rise in society, there is no surprise that same violence has spilled over into the healthcare industry. As a healthcare professional, there are strategies you should know to help de-escalate situations that have the potential to erupt into violence or physical harm. This lecture will provide a way to assess potentially violent encounters and implement strategies and solutions to keep you safer.

At the conclusion of this seminar, the participants should be better able to:

- Recognize individuals exhibiting anxious or threatening behaviors.
- Identify healthcare personnel's roles in managing workplace violence.
- Recall strategies to ensure the safety of self, patients and bystanders, during violent situations in the healthcare setting.

8 am / Youth Suicide: What's bullying got to do with it? Jodi Flick, LCSW, ACSW

Although suicide among youth is rare, it is on the increase. This workshop will look at the most important risk factors for children and teens (including the role of bullying, social media, child maltreatment, access to firearms), and the most valuable protective factors (including social support, access to treatment, safe messaging). Our emphasis will be on the role that each of us can play in effective prevention and postvention efforts.

At the conclusion of this seminar, the participants should be better able to:

- Describe three important risk and three important protective factors for youth suicide.
- Explain the impact of bullying on youth suicide.
- Describe the evidence-based programs for youth suicide prevention.
