Purpose / Target Audience

This symposium is a review and update in primary care medicine intended for family physicians, internists and general practitioners. It also may be of value to physicians preparing for family medicine or internal medicine recertification examinations. Lectures are case based, and participants have the opportunity to actively participate using an audience-response system. - Utilize the raw rates of SSRI failure in depression to define treatment resistant depression (TRD).
- Identify treatments for cognitive decline and behavioral disturbance in Alzheimer's disease.
