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### **Target Audience**

Health care professionals including lactation consultants, physicians, midwives, health educators, nurses, nutritionists, social workers, and others who provide care to mothers and infants in any health care setting are encouraged to participate.

As part of its commitment to diversity and inclusion, the Northwest AHEC and Wake Forest Baptist Health provides compassionate education and respectful care for all, regardless of sexual orientation, gender identity or expression.

### Overview

This course targets health care professionals who work with breastfeeding mothers, and offers necessary knowledge and skills for providing basic breastfeeding management and support. These skills focus on basic prenatal and postpartum counseling, and the management of common concerns and clinical problems.

The interactive training involves five days of didactic sessions, two days of clinical rotations and an independent study assignment. The clinical days will be scheduled to occur between the first two days and last 2 days of the program.

Upon completion of this knowledge program, participants should be better able to:

- Discuss factors that contribute to the breastfeeding decision.
- Explain the importance of optimal positioning and latch-on.
- Identify common considerations and causes of issues with milk supply.
- Describe hospital policies that contribute to successful breastfeeding.

### **Cost and Registration**

Registration Fee – \$450 \$400 Health Department Discount Rate

Space is limited and preregistration is required! Tuition includes both didactic and clinical training, resource manual and teaching materials and credits for six didactic days. A minimum of 10 participants is required with a limit of 60!

Payment Policy — Payment is required on or before entrance into any Northwest AHEC activity. If a corporate payment has not been received prior to the activity start date, you will be required to provide a personal credit card or check. If and when the corporate payment is received, Northwest AHEC will issue a full refund based on your original form of payment. To avoid personal payment, you should check with the financial staff at your organization to determine status of payment.

Refund Policy — Cancellations received in our office at least two weeks (14 business days) before the activity will receive a 100 percent refund. Registrants cancelling between two weeks and two full business days <u>prior to the first day of the event</u> will be refunded at 70% of the registration fee subject to a minimum \$25 cancellation fee. The registration fee will not be refunded if a cancellation is received less than two days before the activity. Cancellations must be in writing (email). You may send a substitute in your place.

When planning for an educational activity, registration fees are not based on credit hours or agenda. Registration fees are based on expenses such as equipment, technology services, staff, etc., and are not adjusted by issues such as cancellation of speakers or other unforeseen circumstances. Every effort will be given to ensure the activity is a success.
