

Clinical Corner: Microlearning Series

Clinical Corner is a series of 4 online microlearning activities focused on high priority health indicators in North Carolina, as outlined in Healthy North Carolina 2030.

Achieving the goals of Healthy NC 2030 requires engaging partners across multiple sectors to improve population health and drive health equity over the next decade (Healthy NC 2030, p.17).

Each module uses the Results-Based Accountability framework of 'Turn the Curve' thinking, and should take about 15 minutes to complete.

Clinical Corner provides:

- o Background and context of the health indicator
- o Concrete steps you can promptly implement in your daily practice. Things you can do make a difference (begin to '[Turn the Curve](#)') in these challenging health indicators, along with resources to support you.



Target Audience

Includes physicians, residents and APP's (physician assistants, nurse practitioners, CNMs and CRNAs)

Objectives

Upon completion of this program, participants will be able to:

- Recognize statewide and other value-based care initiatives aimed at improving population health and the steps they can take to make a difference.
- Apply a population health focused lens to their current practice patterns thereby identifying specific areas to address.
- Differentiate between episodic, fee-for-service-based, and value-based care delivery patterns.
- Implement at least one new practice effort aimed at (a) facilitating change in a patient's health behaviors and/or (b) identify or intervene for unmet social needs of patients.
