Overview

The Charles L. Spurr symposium is designed for physicians, advanced practice providers, nurses, navigators and other health care professionals dedicated to the field of hematology and oncology in settings across the continuum of care. Attendees will benefit from an interactive learning environment in which renowned faculty will present the latest in evidence based oncology care. This in-person meeting will provide didactic presentations and case studies so that participants will gain knowledge about best practice and new advances in treating oncology patients. Participants will return to practice with practical strategies for navigating therapeutic and diagnostic options and care delivery to improve patient outcomes.

Target Audience

Objectives

Upon completion of this program, participants will be better able to:

- Describe the role of molecular testing in colorectal cancer.
- Discuss new antibody-drug conjugates and their use in urothelial carcinoma for metastatic and local disease.
- Describe the future landscape of local and metastatic treatment of urothelial carcinoma.
- Examine the implications of the pathologic response in the choice of adjuvant breast therapy.
- Discuss the timing and toxicities of new agents in the metastatic breast cancer setting.

Objectives (continued)

- Examine the scope and complexity of financial hardship on adolescent and young adult oncology patients.
- Identify scientific and treatment advances in the treatment of lymphomas.
- Discuss changing therapeutic options in esophageal carcinoma.
- Discuss the emotional strain of being an oncology care provider.
- Examine clinical practice guidelines for the diagnosis, treatment and follow-up of lung cancer.
