Program Overview and Objectives

The purpose of Practical Pediatrics 2023 is to offer providers current information relevant to the care of infants, children and adolescents in the outpatient setting.

Upon completion of this program, participants should be better able to:

- Indicate the treatment of patients with infantile hemangiomas and other vascular anomalies.
- Understand allergy testing and pediatrics.
- Identify the DSM-V criteria and clinical features of anorexia and bulimia.
- Discuss national and local burden of firearm injuries and deaths and explore avenues for advocacy.
- Perform focused joint exams and conduct preliminary evaluation for systemic lupus or vasculitis.
- Explain the AAP Clinical Practice Guideline development process and apply the new guidelines to their clinical practice.
- Understand signs of abuse and misuse of controlled substances and the prevalence of opioid use disorder (OUD) in pregnancy.

- Understand the common types of pulmonary function testing available to pediatric physicians.
- Design a sensible therapy regimen for mild to moderate disease, incorporating the "PCP topical steroid toolbox".
- Recognize various forms pediatric acne, the contemporary classification, and some potential mimickers.
- Distinguish between staph scalded skin syndrome and Stevens Johnson Syndrome, and between other inpatient dermatoses.
- Describe the most common forms of alopecia seen in children clinically and trichoscopically and compare treatment options for pediatric alopecias.
- Describe ways to improve patients' treatment adherence and improve patients' treatment adherence.
- Recognize pseudostrabismus and identify different types of real strabismus.
